HOW YOUR SUPPORT TRANSFORMS LIVES: EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE IN ACTION

When Susan lost her job and fell behind on her rent, she feared her family would be evicted just as a harsh winter approached. Fortunately, the community emergency assistance program funded by the United Way stepped in and helped her stay in their home, cover utility bills, and even provide warm winter coats. This was just one of 159 stories where support prevented displacement, utility shutoffs, or dire need after housefires. Each client, like Susan, sought one-time help during a critical moment, demonstrating how this program can make a crucial difference in maintaining stability and comfort during unforeseen hardships.
