With rising rents and mounting debts, many families find themselves struggling to keep up, as was the case for Maria, a single mother juggling multiple financial burdens. Through United Way's funding of the financial management and budget counseling program, Maria and 177 other clients participated in budget and credit counseling sessions, gaining crucial skills to navigate their challenging situations. While 25% cited housing issues as a primary concern, many also faced difficulties with money management, student loan debt, and reduced incomes. The increase in debt management appointments reflects a growing need for assistance in managing credit to cover essential expenses. Thanks to your support, these clients are not only receiving guidance but also finding hope and stability in their financial futures.
